Re: Protest Camps - Sun Peaks Resort

I have been directed to advise that, further to the Trespass Notices posted on October 17, 2001, the Province will be posting Seizure Notices pursuant to the Land Act at the protest camps within the Controlled Recreation Area at Sun Peaks Resort, and at McGillivray Lake, on Friday, November 16, 2001.

The improvements, goods, chattels and other materials will become the property of the Crown under section 59(8) of the Land Act once the Seizure Notices are posted and a sheriff or public officer has carried out the direction to seize as set out in the Notices. Under section 59(8), they may be sold, rented, removed or destroyed immediately following the seizure.

Any items removed will be stored at Versatile Storage at 2095 West Trans Canada Highway, Kamloops, and available to be claimed during the business hours of that facility.

In keeping with your request of October 15, 2001, the Province advises that the RCMP have been asked to attend in a peacekeeping role.
